#### **Title of the Special Issue: Minorities, diasporas, refugees in contemporary Europe**

At the beginning of the 21st century, Europe faces several political, social and economic challenges, both internally and externally; changed dynamics of migratory flows is one of them. In this context, several issues have been brought to the surface of the debate and several challenges need to be faced, e.g. international protection and asylum in Europe and its neighbourhood, including Central and Eastern Europe (CEE). Migratory flows and challenges that they trigger have left a lasting mark on CEE's identity over the centuries. Analysis suggests that overlaps and spill-overs between past and present migration-related experiences unfold and that useful lessons may be drawn from exploiting them. Indeed, in changing political, social and economic circumstances at regional and national levels, issues related to multiple aspects of migration and integration of immigrants, including minorities, diasporas and refugees, require an in-depth analysis both at theoretical and empirical level; historical contexts and the current state of play need to be considered too. This Issue of the Yearbook is dedicated to these research topics.
